Paddy Killer, Isobel Currie, Hannah Lamb and myself were there to represent the 62 Group but there were very few visitors to talk to, although I understand from Elaine Parkinson, Upfront Gallery owner, that there had been a steady flow of visitors earlier in the week when the weather wasn't as good. There are 39 pieces of work on show, and it's a lovely area with lots of places to stay if you fancy a weekend away before 10 May. Looking forward to our next exhibition in 2016 I will be meeting in a couple of weeks time with Sue Hughes, director of Macclesfield Museums, and Michelle Stephens, who will co-ordinate the exhibition. We will be finalising the details and clarify how we will connect with the Barnaby Festival in Macclesfield in June 2016. More details about this will be sent out in a separate email.

Members of the public often get in touch to ask if our exhibitions are touring other venues so with this in mind four committee members met with curator Liz Cooper on 27 February. Many of you will know Liz from her involvement with the Knitting & Stitching Shows. We are trying to formulate a touring exhibition which will cover all parts of the UK. We would like to include ideas from the wider membership in our discussions with Liz and would welcome suggestions for themes for this exhibition. Please bear in mind that these need to have the scope for wide interpretation because of the diverse nature of the members of the 62 Group. Rachael Howard will be Liz Cooper's main contact for this project and Helen Banzhaf will be taking over, temporarily, as the New Member's officer. Thank you to them both on behalf of the 62 Group for giving up their valuable time for this. UPFRONT UPDATE

There has been plenty of publicity for the exhibition, thanks to the hard work of Hannah Lamb, our publicity officer, including a full page ad in *Embroidery* magazine (thanks to the continuing support of Jo Hall) and we have been utilising our Facebook and Twitter as well. There were 49 submissions from 35 members and eventually, after a very long selection day with much discussion, 39 pieces were selected for the exhibition. Thank you to those members who submitted work for the exhibition and to members who helped with selection.

Paddy Killer and Sue Stone helped with the hanging on Monday 16 March. On reflection the turnaround time from the end of the previous exhibition on Sunday 15 March at 4.30pm to the start of our exhibition on Tuesday 17 March was way too short. The gallery always do the turnaround this way so we didn't really have a choice but it was quite stressful. Instant decisions had to be made and there was no time for careful placing. Our exhibition space was also changed at the last minute. The space we ended up with is spread over three areas. The first space downstairs is well lit and visible from the outside. The second is upstairs and very large but we were not allowed to use all of it. A third space is in the corridor leading to the large area. So the exhibition is rather disjointed but this was beyond our control.

Thank you to Paddy Killer for re-doing all the labels at short notice and in adverse conditions when the ones we were provided with were not up to standard, and for providing the extra signage directing the public to the different parts of the exhibition.

“Space is the theme for the 2016 Barnaby Festival; it will be used by the Parade/Carnival, the community centrepiece of the festival, and it will be interpreted by a number of commissioned visual artists. We expect it will also be the theme for our first commissioned performance/participatory project ... very exciting. We don't wish to be too prescriptive in our definition ... it could be internal/external space; outer or dark space; enclosing space; mapping and travelling through space; personal space; digital or virtual space; 3d space etc. From discussions so far, and it is early days, I think there will be a number of projects inspired by the solar system and outer space.”

**62 Group Committee Meeting
Saturday 28 February 2015, National Theatre, London**

Minutes

1. Apologies: Heather Belcher, Hannah Lamb, Sian Martin

Present: Sue Stone (Chair), Lucy Brown, Penny Burnfield, Rachael Howard, Caren Garfen, Ann Goddard, Jan Miller, Marilyn Rathbone, Michelle Stephens.

2. Minutes from committee meeting 6/12/2014: As there were no matters arising these were agreed.

3. Committee Jobs & Changes

- Senior members of the committee were agreed. These are Sue Stone, Heather Belcher and Lucy Brown.
- We still require an Exhibitions Officer. Any member taking on the role would be co-opted onto the committee.

4. Submissions, Clause 4 - Instigator or Author - Collaborative Working

- There was a discussion on the wording of Clause 4 & how it relates to current practice.
- The committee agreed there is no problem with collaborative work between members. Potential difficulties may arise if members submit work produced through collaboration with non-members/amateurs.
- The general consensus was that our exhibition selection criteria provides a backup to ensure the quality of work is upheld.

5. Exhibitions Update & Meeting with Liz Cooper

Upfront

- Paddy Killer has produced an e-flyer for the PV invite which has been sent out to members to forward to their contact lists.
- Statements are to be sent to Sue by Tues 3 March. Ann Goddard will send an email reminder.
- Selection on Sat 24 March. Selection panel - Sue Stone, Paddy Killer, Isobel Currie, Ann Goddard, Elaine Parkinson (gallery representative). Jane McKeating has kindly offered to do the admin.
- Sue will take *Radical Thread* & *Ebb & Flow* catalogues to sell in the shop. Price: £10 for *Radical Thread*, £5 for *Ebb & Flow*. Sue will also try & sell these through Amazon. We will still make a profit on any sales despite the Amazon charge.
- Hanging will be done by the gallery. The committee felt there should be 2 group members to help so Sue and Paddy will assist.
- Collection of work in person on Sun 10 May 4.30pm-6.30pm, Mon 11 May 10am-4pm

- Courier collection to be arranged for Tuesday 12 May - Thursday 14 May
- Sue will put an appeal in the next NL to ask for volunteers to help with the take down.

Macclesfield

- There has been no contact since last June due to a change in personnel at the Silk Museum.
- All dealings so far have been quite negative. We have been told to apply for the Barnaby Festival and pay for everything ourselves. Both sides have sent contracts but nothing has been agreed yet.
- Michelle Stephens will be undertaking research at the museum so has kindly offered to liaise with Sue Hughes, the museum director and arrange a meeting. Michelle has spoken previously to Sue Hughes and says she seems enthusiastic about the 62 Group exhibition.
- It was agreed that we go ahead with the show.

Meeting with Liz Cooper - report from Sue Stone

- Sue Stone, Rachael Howard, Heather Belcher, and Lucy Brown met with Liz Cooper on 27 February at Craft Central to discuss how the 62 Group could work with Liz Cooper who is very well informed about the 62 Group and our activities. She first came across the 62 Group in 2002 when she helped at K&SS with the 40th Anniversary exhibition and has kept track of the Group ever since. She is very enthusiastic at working with us.
- The 4 members from the 62 Group had a discussion before Liz arrived and all agreed they would be interested in her helping us with a Touring Exhibition which had a broad spread across the UK or even to include a venue outside the UK to give us a wider audience. Sue Stone commented that she had been contacted several times during *Ebb & Flow* by interested fans of the 62 Group enquiring if the exhibition was going on tour and has also had members of the public contact her through FB to see if the Upfront exhibition was going to tour.
- Themes were discussed and Liz had a number of points of interest: reuse and repair; process; text and language; and place and geography. The need for a simple theme was mentioned, with the scope for wide interpretation because of the diverse nature of the members of the 62 Group.
- Funding for the project would need to be secured. Liz has a lot of experience in drawing down funding and is willing to help write the bid. The importance of having an exhibitions co-ordinator to liaise with Liz was discussed and we agreed to get one in place asap. Liz would also like the 62 Group to get a theme in place for the project as early as possible to give members plenty of time to produce work for this exciting exhibition. Selection would need to take place well in advance of the exhibition to give time to publicise it well.
- It was decided to go ahead with this and to invite Liz to our next committee meeting to discuss themes further.
- Sue will contact Liz to find a mutually convenient date for the next meeting.

6. Publicity

- Hannah Lamb was unable to be at the meeting but sent a report.
- She thanked Sue's husband Dave for designing a good clear logo for 62 Group: Now, which is being used on all publicity.
- Upfront Gallery has put information about the exhibition on their website.
- The gallery will be contacting local press directly and they will also send out an E-flyer to their mailing list.
- Paddy Killer has designed a pdf e-flyer and poster for the exhibition and has images for this.
- Michelle Stephens has images for the website.
- Embroidery magazine have offered to do an editorial.
- Online listings: Embroiderers' Guild (free), *Selvedge* (£48), ArtRabbit (free), Crafts Council (free) pending.
- Hannah asked if a publicity budget could be set well in advance of an exhibition. The committee agreed that a budget for publicity and design work be set at the beginning of future projects. This would give us the option to use the services of a professional designer and to make the best use of the money we have.

Website

- Michelle Stephens has had a short training session (45mins over Skype) with Inigo our website providers.
- She has encountered many snags when entering information on the website but as Inigo were reluctant to pass on information Michelle is having to do things by trial & error.
- Sue and Michelle have checked through the website & noted changes that could be made. There are still 2 members without an artist's page; a way needs to be found to reposition the images for the thumbnails to make them more interesting; not all the links are working; members also need to update their CV's before the exhibition.
- We are contracted with Inigo until May but it was agreed that we look to change host.
- Sue suggested the possibility of applying for funding to revamp the website and will get quotes from web designers.

7. Education

- There was no funding available for an education programme at Upfront.
- Lucy Brown received three proposals. The gallery chose a workshop and business talk by Paddy Killer.
- Lucy will put information from the Grimsby exhibition on the website.

8. Newsletter

- Jan Miller apologised for the Winter NL being late and thanked Penny Burnfield & Sian Martin for stepping in when Paddy Killer became too ill to work on it.

- Next NL will be in April. Deadline 31 March
- Emily Jo Gibbs has kindly agreed to produce a public newsletter to be sent out to our mailing list quarterly.
- We have 270 names on the mailing list which have come from people signing up on the website & at the Ebb & Flow exhibition. Ann Goddard also has a list of recent names from the webmail which she will forward to Michelle for adding to MailChimp.
- The public NL will be sent out on 1 Mar, 1 Jun, 1 Sept, 1 Dec.
- Members' news which misses the deadlines can be emailed to Sue who will put it on Facebook.

9. New Members

- Rachael Howard has updated the website information for new membership applications.
- Deadline for applications is 3 June 2015.
- 1st Selection will take place at Helen Banzhaf's house in London on 6 June.
- 2nd Selection will take place at Rachael Howard's house on 7 November, on the Wirral
- The image for the adverts has been changed. Joanna Kinnersly-Taylor helped with this. Adverts have been placed in *Selvedge*, *a-n*, and *Embroidery*.

10. Archives

- Caren Garfen has encountered problems. She is unable to access the archives as she is not archive trained so must be accompanied and there is no-one to help her.
- There has been a change of policy at Goldsmiths. If the archive is to remain there it has to be offered to them & they will own it. We have to consider whether we want this or if we should take the archive away.
- Goldsmiths are checking the form signed by Helen Weston to see what was previously agreed.
- Caren has been sent a new form. Goldsmiths would like to set up a meeting when things have been reviewed

11. AOB

- Joanna Kinnersly-Taylor has requested a sabbatical. This was agreed.
- The date for the next AGM was confirmed as Saturday 5 December 2015

12. Date of next meeting: Date to be confirmed to enable Liz Cooper to join the meeting.

Andy Christian, the Curator writes:

"The word Power has a number of meanings but it is most frequently used to denote authority, command and domination. But power can also mean a quality or property, a particular faculty of body or mind, a force of energy, a special ability or potency. It can infer intrinsic vigour and eloquence. It is for the expression of these latter, rather overlooked meanings that I appreciate in the work of these ten artists. I have sought work that might unsettle viewers in the hope that some may visit the exhibition and leave viewing the world in a slightly different way. I have tried to avoid the decorative in favour of works that might invoke disquiet or wonder. No notice has been taken of contemporary uses of media classifications or genres and I have chosen those whose work I think fits quite comfortably within the embracing term artists."
