

The main sources for income received this year were a payment from the Canal and River Trust in relation to BTB, and a generous legacy from Audrey Walker. Other income has been from our own resources such as membership fees and catalogue sales. The major expenses are the website and the facilities for internal and external communication, such as Zoom, MailChimp and Curatorspace subscriptions. Miscellaneous expenses consisted mainly of postage for catalogue sales.

We spent a reasonable amount on exhibitions and travel and accommodation, however the main component of these costs were the BTB videos by Lucy Forrester from Proudfox.

Forecast for next year

Looking at 22/23, we will be introducing the first group of associate members and will need to keep an eye on how the cost of this impacts our annual spending.

Costs for exhibitions will be fairly high this year as we have both the Knit&Stitch show, and the Sunny Bank Mills exhibitions. We have invested in further videos, as well as excellent graphics for our stand and social media output to celebrate our 60th anniversary.

Membership, submission and hanging fees remain our main income, however, this is looking healthy with member numbers remaining fairly stable.

The committee has agreed that membership fees won't go up in September 2023. This will be reviewed at the next AGM.

How to pay

We are updating the ways that members can pay. This will come into effect as of the date of the AGM.

You can pay by direct bank transfer, or via Paypal. We no longer accept cheques.

For Paypal payments, please email me the amount that you need to pay and I will send you a payment request. Please note that due to the way Paypal fees work, we will be passing these fees onto members who wish to pay in this way - usually £0.30 + 2.9% of the amount.

I have written a guidance document with the bank account details and the Paypal details which has been uploaded to the members area of the website for you to access.

A personal note

I now have a newborn baby. I would appreciate your patience as I adjust, which means I may take longer to respond or pay invoices. Thank you!

It was proposed and agreed by all members to keep the membership and hanging fees the same next year after which there will be a further review and recommendation brought to the AGM.

Membership

- We currently have 57 Exhibiting members, 6 Honorary Exhibiting members, 19 Honorary Non-Exhibiting members, and 10 Friends. In our new Associate members category we now have our first 2 members.
- We have four members on a sabbatical at present. Imogen Aust, Joanna Kinnersley-Taylor, Gladys Paulus and Caron Penney.
- Three members, Jeanette Appleton, Penny Burnfield, and Gerri Spilka have resigned as Exhibiting members due to their personal circumstances.
- Four new exhibiting members have now been selected and we welcome Mark McLeish, Athena Nemeth, Jane Walkley and Dr Hannah White and our new associate members Helen Davies and Woo Jin Joo to the Group.
- I did a brief study of the membership over the last 10 years or so and can report that the Exhibiting membership (including Honorary exhibiting members) has grown slightly from around 56 in 2011 to 63 now, and that the level of submissions and acceptances to exhibitions remains fairly stable. We should be aware that if we grow the number of members further, it may impact on logistics and suitable exhibition spaces.
- As always, please make sure you keep all contact information up-todate so that you receive newsletters and reminders about exhibition deadlines; also check that your subs payments have been made, so that you don't risk losing your membership by default.

Associate Members

There are lessons to be learned as this was our first year of applications so Vanessa will lead a review and iteration of the process.

Associate Membership Scheme

- We launched the Associate Membership Scheme in early February 2022 with the aim of widening the reach of our membership.
- We received 85 very high quality applications (via curator space deadline 1/6/22). Several applicants were invited to apply for new members instead as it was felt more appropriate for their stage of practice.
- Yemi Awosile was the invited external panelist for 1st stage selection.
- 10 shortlisted applicants were contacted and invited to send work for second selection on 23/9/22. Selection took place with 5 members of the group on the section panel.
- 2 artists were selected Helen Davies and Woo Jin Joo We are delighted to welcome them to the group.
- Our associate members now have a page on our artist directory and have had their profile shared via our social media channels.
- They will receive £500 this year and £500 next year to support them with expenses connected to their practice.
- We are exploring the best routes to providing support around developing their practice with them.

New Members

Thanks to Ealish for running the process this year but as she is taking on the Exhibitions role, we are now looking for someone to look after the New Members applications.

We had 44 applications for New Members with a vast array of exciting work.

We chose 11 artists to move forward to the second stage and selected our 4 new members from them.

General Feedback for Selection

Please read all the info on the sending-in forms carefully

- Read the brief and mark dates in your calendar
- All information is on the member's area of the website
- You should photograph your work professionally. Bad photography will mean you might not get selected for the exhibition
- We need good photography for the press this is crucial for marketing - but also so that we can promote everyone in a fair way
- Ensure you get the entire artwork into the photograph, including all edges. The selection panel need to see the piece in full
- The panel also need to see how the work is displayed.
- Please don't leave your submission to the last minute of the deadline. We can better support IT issues if there is more time. In addition, the panel and committee have other commitments.

- Workshop and pdf was shared on 12/7/22.
- Follow up Q&A live with Lucy on 29/7/22 this was also shared with members to allow those who couldn't attend live to follow up.
- Members then submitted footage and voice over, edited into a showreel by Lucy.
- The film is hosted on our webpage alongside the Essence info via our new Vimeo account and was also exhibited at both Alexandra Palace and Harrogate.
- Artists have been provided with their individual short film for use on any platform they choose.

Education

Essence

- During 'Essence' at Alexandra Palace and Harrogate during October/November 2022 there were the following education events:
- A talk at Alexandra Palace by Catherine exploring the history and legacy of 62 Group.
- Stand tours led by 62 Group members x 2 at Alexandra Palace and x 6 at Harrogate
- Handling collection available as part of the exhibition
- Thanks to members who offered to provide tours. Take up of offered tours was varied, as many people just spoke with members as they looked around in a more informal way.
- Feedback on this would be welcome to explore repeating this kind of event in future.

Education

Much discussion on rates for workshops. It was agreed that a day rate for the 62 group should be established.

Rates between £220 - £280 were put forward but further work will be done to establish a fair rate that members are happy with (both for those who might feel 'priced out' or those who fell they might lose from their normal rate). Exploring A-N rates will form part of this process.

A proposal on a rate will follow.

Sunny Bank Mills

- There is an opportunity to develop a programme alongside 'Tailored' for their Textiles Festival - 12/13/14 May 2023
- Possibilities outlined by Jane (Director at Sunny Bank Mills) below:
 - Archive tour on the Friday afternoon followed by a curators tour of your exhibition.
 - Textile based talks in the Old Woollen over the weekend there will probably be 4 talks on both the Saturday and Sunday.
 Sunny Bank Mills would fund these and they will be ticketed
 - A Fair in the 1912 Mill with accompanying demonstrations etc
 - A workshop programme for the weekend these will mainly take place in the studio spaces – of which there are now 3
 - Workshop programme for the exhibition

- The info for both categories of membership was also circulated to all universities and colleges who are members of FtC (Association of Fashion & Textiles Courses).


Publicity for 'Essence'

 touch.



Public & Members' Newsletter

Membership Categories

Isobel led a discussion around how we could manage Honorary Exhibiting Members going forward. Ideas:

- There would be a time limit of 5 years if they don't engage (Gavin raised parity with current members which is 3 years)
- Could other forms of engagement count? (Isobel eg speaking, curating, helping find exhibitions etc)

Catherine and Isobel are to meet with Alice Kettle to explore options and will bring back a proposal to the committee.

- We have very little engagement from most of our six Honorary Exhibiting members, with one exception. They did not engage with the 60th Anniversary show as we had hoped they might. Some have not submitted work in the last 10 years (although of course some have not been in this category for that long) Catherine has contacted these members to see if they still engage with the Group but has not yet received any replies.
- Is it enough just to have these prestigious names associated with the 62 Group? Do the
 public expect to see work by these members at 62 Group exhibitions? When considering
 exhibition spaces for future exhibitions Honorary Exhibiting members must be counted as
 potential exhibitors, but in fact rarely submit.
- They may perhaps not be in the most appropriate category- some were made into Honorary Exhibiting members when they had not been able to regularly submit work, but they will probably still not submit for the same reasons they gave up being Exhibiting members, such as ongoing ill-heath. Where this is the case, it may be more appropriate to move them to the Honorary Non-Exhibiting membership category and remove the expectation of submissions from them.
- Honorary Exhibiting members could be given a limited tenure of x years in this category or be asked regularly if they want to continue to hold this position if they have not engaged.
- We could leave the existing Honorary Exhibiting members as they are but be more mindful
 in future which category is appropriate when we want to invite new members to the
 Honorary Exhibiting and Non-Exhibiting categories.
- Is there anything that can be done to encourage these members to engage more?




